

Online Legal Platforms:

- Expensive
- Not accessible to everyone
- Requires understanding of legal language

Legal Reporters:

- Delay in updating
- Not accessible to everyone
- Being phased out in many offices

What else is there?

- ChatGPT
- Google Scholar
- Harvard Caselaw Access Project

What do we need to do to make research easier and more accessible?

- Lower cost
 - Easier/Natural Language Search
 - Easier to read
 - Hyperlinks
 - Ease of translation to other languages







What is Free Law Project?

CourtListener

- 9M opinions from over a thousand jurisdictions
- Nearly complete SCOTUS record
- More opinions scraped from court websites daily (about 300/day)
- Search and docket alerts for journalists, lawyers, and the public

Bots.law

- Our bots will send case updates to Slack, Discord, MS Teams, Google Chat, Twitter or BlueSky.
- Our big cases bot follows the biggest federal cases in the country
- Little cases bots follow cases in specific areas of law -Al Cases, Anti-Trust, Free Speech, Sealing, and more

RECAP

Turning PACER Around Since 2009

- Browser extensions that save you money while you use PACER.
- Everything you purchase gets added to our public archive and gets a permalink.
- Everything anybody else purchased you get for free.

Advocacy





 - Access to traditional research tools
 - o Time
 - Skill / Knowledge

- How Free Tech Tools can help
 - Natural language summaries for quicker review
 - Hyperlinks to cases
 - Cut down time to figure out which cases to read
 - Attorney recruitment
 - Recruit through supporting pro bono work outside usual wheelhouse / practice



Free Tech Tools: The Pro Se Litigant Perspective









Access to Justice

Full access to research tools provides the knowledge necessary to participate meaningfully in the justice system

No 'Legalese'

Natural language / easy to interpret context

Advice Only

Inability to Fully Serve / Advice Only only cases

In-house research by staff using natural language to help find cases to read that are applicable to the case.

Alternatives

Tools could reduce pro se use of ChatGPT

Minimize risk of pro se litigant using AI 'hallucinations' as basis for legal position
