CourtListener.com - Case Law

- 9M opinions from over a thousand jurisdictions
- Nearly complete SCOTUS record
- More opinions scraped from court websites daily (about 300/day)
- Search and docket alerts for journalists, lawyers, and the public
- API, bulk data, searchable interface

- Browser extensions for Chrome, Safari, Edge, and Firefox that save you money while you use PACER.
- Everything you purchase gets added to our public archive and gets a permalink.
- Everything anybody else purchased you get for free.
- Use RECAP to save money and contribute to a public archive.
- Over 20k users







CourtListener.com - RECAP Archive

- Biggest open collection of federal filings online 60M cases and 300M items
- Sourced from:
 - Crawling free opinions from PACER
 - RECAP Extension and @recap.email
 - PACER RSS feeds
 - Bulk data gathering services
 - Big Cases Twitter bot & handful of topical case bots
- Full text searchable including scanned docs



CourtListener.com - RECAP Archive

- Excellent for investigative research:
 - Full text search makes background checks more complete
 - Biggest open and searchable collection of federal court filings
- Innumerable historical documents from federal cases:
 - U.S. v. Manafort, U.S. v. Gates, U.S. v. Michael Cohen
 - The "Citizenship on the Census" case
 - "DNC v. Russian Trolls" case
 - Trump Emoluments
- Alerts for dockets to know when new filings are available
- Services available for bulk research without having law clerks click thousands of PACER documents



Security Concerns:

- How are cases with restricted access pursuant to FRCP 5.2(c) treated?
 - i.e., Social Security cases where there are clients' medical records, description of medical records, and SSNs.
- How are sealed submissions treated?
- What about when Court staff in error fail to seal a document?
- Is there a way to selectively choose which submissions to share?
- What is the method for review on Free Law Project's end?
- What if attorney wants to remove something that has been shared to RECAP?

Responses to Concerns:


- Users are encouraged to use PACER accounts, not ECF accounts.
- RECAP is designed to detect sealed content and not upload it.
- RECAP can be easily set to not upload at all.
- A new feature provides two buttons to users: (1) "Purchase and RECAP" and (2) "Purchase without Sharing" (thanks LASNNY).
- Documents can be pulled out of the RECAP Archive if needed.
- In practice this hasn't been a big issue.

CASE STUDY TIMELINE





Overview of Case Study: Demographics

8 participants identified at LASNNY to participate:



- All were moderately to very comfortable with using new technology
- All spent between 1 and 10 hours per week researching cases in preparation for helping clients
- The most used source for research was West Law





HOW TO IMPLEMENT:

01

Individual Training

This is what we did:

- Ability to answer questions
- Tailor to the individuals needs
- Time consuming
- More feedback for implementers

03

Individual Exploration

Install on everyone's computers and let people explore

02

Group Training

- Quick and easy
- Easy to miss details

04

Combination

This is our recommendation:

- Install on computers
- Allow for 1:1 trainings or office hours if needed
- Small group trainings that are recorded

Overview of Case Study: Trainings

- Individuals signed up for 1:1 training sessions/user interviews with Mike Lissner
 - Allowed for individualized help depending on comfort level with PACER and technology
- What we discovered:
 - Most of the attorneys in the case study did not use, or have use for PACER in their daily work - so ended up talking more about using CourtListener instead of RECAP
 - Definite pain points in selecting jurisdictions in search interface
- Followed up with weekly open office hours via Google Meet
 - Offered to provide assistance with case research via PACER/RECAP and/or CourtListener
 - Not effectively used wrong time? Not needed? Too soon?

Overview of Case Study: Results

- Case study constrained due to type of work (state vs. federal)
- Adding feature to RECAP extension to address concerns with sealed cases
- Additional research needed to look at modifications to CourtListener interface and features to be more useful to civil legal services advocates

"It's an excellent resource, especially for those who do not have access to Pacer. The ability to "quick sort" cases by clicking through the different filters is very fluid and makes searching easy."

"A few of site's functions felt unintuitive to me (such as the 'clear tab' and 'clear all' buttons in the jurisdiction search). But once it was explained to me, it was easy to navigate the functions."



"I love the idea of RECAP... Unfortunately I do not practice in Federal court, so I haven't been able to use it much personally but I fully support the idea of freely accessed data."

Use in a Legal Services Setting


Use In Legal Services:

- Use RECAP Archive to freely search for, download, share, and read filings
- Save costs vs. other providers by using the Archive as your first stop:
 - No subscription costs, easily accessible online
 - Very powerful search
- Create up to 15 docket alerts to follow federal cases (more alerts for members)
- Listen to oral argument audio or make podcasts for courts
- Study judges before trials:
 - Judicial Financial Disclosure reports could show conflicts
 - Judge DB has education, work history, and more for thousands of judges
- Stop paying for PACER content over and over again.
- Share links for advice only cases to assist pro se litigants
